The main transport in London is tube and bus. Most people here have an Oyster travel card to get around London. Depending on your duration of stay and how much you travel, it would be advisable to either consider Pay As You Go or an 18+ Student travel card. For the latter, you have to apply online and Middlesex University has to confirm your student status.

APPROXIMATE COST OF LIVING (per month)

The list below will give you a guideline to how much to budget for the month. These amounts are subject to change according to your circumstances. Please note that London is one of the most expensive cities in the world.

Halls fee/private rent	£560/600
Food/Housekeeping	£140
Travel/Transport	up to £100

Additional one-off costs: flights, soft furnishings for room, holidays, other luxuries.

HEALTH INSURANCE POLICY

Britain has a subsidised health service called the NHS (National Health Service) which provides free health care and treatment for people who are resident in Britain. This includes all students enrolled on a programme lasting for more than six months. Routine optical and dental treatment is not normally covered by the NHS.
