REQUIREMENTS

The general prerequisite for bachelor exchange students is at least one year of completed university studies at the home institution before the exchange semester. We recommend prerequisites with the equivalency of a bachelor degree of at least three or four years for applicants interested in master level courses.

All students must fulfil the prerequisites of each chosen course. When signing the Choice of Courses - Confirmation the home institution certifies that the student fulfill the prerequisites for each chosen course

GRADING SYSTEM AND STUDY LEVELS

HLK The grading scale runs from A to Fx. The grades A, B, C, D, and E are all passing grades. A and B indicate that the student has proven very good or excellent results in relation to the intended learning outcomes of the course. C indicates that the student has proven good and sound results, D that the student has proven satisfactory results, and E that the student has proven the sufficient minimum to pass the course (fulfilling all intended learning outcomes of the course). F or sometimes Fx is provided when a student has not succeeded in reaching the required level for a certain element of examination or intended learning outcome. Students who receive an F or Fx are offered re-examination on the course element(s) in question (e.g. written assignment, written exam, oral presentation).

HEALTH INSURANCE

Exchange students admitted at Jönköping University (JU) receive a supplementary health insurance, which covers emergency medical and dental care. The insurance applies during direct travel between the home country and Sweden, during the education period, as well as two weeks prior to the start of the studies and two weeks after the end of the studies. The insurance applies 24 hours a day in the Schengen region. The insurance also includes a basic property cover.

Please note: Citizens of a Nordic country, EU/EEA country, Switzerland, or other country with which a convention regarding medical benefits exists: if students are in need of other medical assistance that is not an emergency, the students must have a EU card or similar from their home country. These students will be expected to pay the same health care fees as Swedish residents.

Since the insurance is for emergencies only, students are recommended to obtain a complementary insurance.
